EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The institute as a tradition organized its annual research meeting (ARM) in 2022 under the theme "Epidemics, Pandemics and Diseases of Public Health Importance: Bridging the research-policy divide". The theme was apt following the global SARS-COV-19 pandemic, which affected human health, the economies etc. in many countries including Ghana.

The ARM was attended by over 350 participants that ranged from policymakers, decision-takers, collaborators, funders, and representatives from international and local non-governmental organizations, early career scientists, both graduate undergraduate students and the general public. The luminaries who attended the two-day event included Prof. Nana Aba Appiah Amfo, Vice-Chancellor, University of Ghana, Dr Anarfi Asamoa-Baah, former Deputy Director-General of the World Health Organization and currently the Coordinator for the Ghana-COVID-19 Response Support Programme, Dr Abdourahmane SOW (West African Health Organization), Professor John Gyapong former Vice Chancellor of UHAS, and a representative from the Africa Center for Disease Control (African CDC) in Ethiopia. The ARM, which took the form of lectures and poster presentations offered senior and young scientists, and students the opportunity to showcase their excellent research. Stands were also provided to pharmaceutical and medical companies to exhibit their wares. The climax to the two-day event was the debate on "The global race against epidemics and pandemics is a hopeless case" A major outcome of the ARM was the deepening of the collaboration. with the Ghana Health Service, which in addition to COVID-19 control efforts has led to the Institute detecting emerging and

re-emerging diseases including recent Marburg and Monkeypox, yellow fever and meningitis outbreaks

Summary of Activities

Opening ceremony

The morning of the first day of the meeting was the opening of the meeting which was chaired by the Vice Chancellor, UG – Professor Nana Aba Appiah Amfo and in attendance was the Provost of the College of Health Sciences, Professor Julius Fobil, the Registrar of the University of Ghana and other top officials of the University. Also in attendance were representatives from JICA, the Embassy of Japan, Disease Control Managers from the Ghana Health Services and many more. The ceremony was concluded with the keynote address by Dr Anarfi Asamoa-Baah who spoke on the strategies for ensuring uptake of research data for policy formulation.

Scientific Sessions

There were 12 plenary speakers of which six were senior researchers from the Institute strategically selected to align with the theme of the meeting. Six scientific sessions included 30 oral presentations on a wide range of topics with policy implications, which ended with the iconic debate.

The first session was dedicated to pandemic preparedness and emerging health threats and the speakers were Dr Abdourahmane Sow from the West Africa Health Organization (WAHO). Dr Sow spoke on the West African Regional Public Health agenda in the context of pandemic preparedness and response. The session was concluded with a talk by Professor William Ampofo who elaborated on NMIMR's contributions towards epidemic outbreaks in Ghana. The session was chaired by Professor Fred Binka, former

Vice Chancellor of the University of Health and Allied Sciences.

The second plenary session on epidemics and pandemic diseases and interventions was delivered by Professor Sebastien Gagneux on the evolution and spread of multi-drug resistant tuberculosis, which was followed with presentations by Noguchi scientists on viruses, tuberculosis, Buruli ulcer and rotavirus research at the Institute. There were also parallel sessions where 20 oral presentations on viral infections, drug discovery, bacterial Infections, malaria and other protozoan infections to conclude Day 1.

The other four plenary sessions were covered on the second day 18th November 2022 and plenary session three was on vector-borne diseases that was kick started by our special Guest Speaker - Prof Gyapong who gave an excellent talk to participants on the Neglected Tropical Diseases (NTDs) research landscape and challenges with elimination programmes. This session also

highlighted the Institute's contributions to Entomology, Neglected Tropical Diseases and Malaria research. Day 1 concluded with a session for 10 selected posters of young scientists to give two-minute turbo oral presentations of their research.

Day 2

Two parallel scientific sessions on NTDs, Climate Change and Health Systems, were followed by plenary session 4 on non-communicable diseases delivered by Professor Dwomoa Adu on Trypanosomiasis and Kidney Failures.

Plenary session 5 was dedicated to the AMED/NMIMR project on viral haemorrhagic fevers and diarrhoeal diseases, antimicrobial resistance, and entomology and concluded the session with a presentation by JICA on a project in supporting NMIMR Quality management systems (QMS).

Debate

The last scientific activity of the day, which was the debate. The motion for the 2022 ARM was "Global race against epidemics and pandemics is a hopeless case". Drs Isaac Otchere Darko and Peter Quashie spoke for the motion and Drs Ivy Asante and Paul Owusu-Donkor spoke against it. The Judges were Professor Kwadwo Koram, Professor William Ampofo and Dr Justice Yankson from the Ghana Medical Association. The debate was excellent and very educative and those who spoke against the motion won the day.

CONCLUSION

The ARM was very successful and was attended by 800 participants, which was far more than the estimated 350. The participation of young scientists also exceeded our expectation evidenced by the 245 applications. The scientific contents were excellent and several positive feedbacks from policymakers, collaborators, funders, and the general public were received.

The chosen theme "Epidemics, Pandemics and Diseases of Public Health Importance: Bridging the research-policy divide" was apt recognising that the COVID-19 pandemic brought to bear key challenges encountered by the health authorities in Ghana. A key challenge of capacity in anticipation of future epidemics/pandemics has formed the basis of the theme for the next ARM in November 2023, which is "Strengthening Research Capacity to Mitigate Current and Future Disease Threats".

POSTSCRIPT

A major outcome of the ARM was the deepening of the collaboration with the Ghana Health Service, which in addition to the continued COVID-19 control efforts has led to the Institute identifying recent outbreaks of Marburg virus disease, monkeypox virus, yellow fever and meningitis.
